Meeting to order

Voting aye thereon: Kochis, McNeer, Burns, Szabrak, Ferguson, Kaper, and Fagan Motion passed.

Approval for Election of Officers

On motion of Bill McNeer and second of Rick Szabrak, the Fairfield County Airport Authority Board voted to have Glenn Burns remain as President and Pat Ferguson to remain as Vice President.

Voting aye thereon: McNeer, Szabrak, Burns, Ferguson, Kaper, Fagan, and Kochis. Motion passed.

Historical Aircraft Squadron (HAS) update

Mr. Moyer reported that they are maintaining and making small repairs to the new snow plow truck. He requested that a load be added to the bed of the truck.

Mr. Kochis stated that he will contact the Engineer's Office for rocks to be added to the bed of the truck.

Mr. Moyer reported that the 5510-tractor's clutch is slipping. The estimate to repair from JD Equipment is \$3,500. It needs to be repaired in the winter before spring.

Mr. Kochis reported that a new tractor with attachments is approximately \$70,000.

Approval to repair the 5510-tractor with JD Equipment

On motion of Michael Kaper and second of Jon Kochis, the Fairfield County Airport Authority Board voted to approve the repair to the 5510-tractor with JD Equipment.

Voting aye thereon: Kaper, Kochis, Burns, Fagan, Ferguson, Szabrak, and McNeer Motion passed.

Mr. Moyer reported that the taxiway current regulator is still not powered up. That means it is still piggybacking on the runway lights.

Mr. Kochis reported that the parts for the lighting project are hard to come by. The lighting project is still ongoing. It is on the punch list for spring.

Mr. Moyer asked if we are receiving any spare parts from the lighting project.

Mr. Kochis reported that there are a few spares. When the project is closed out we will know for sure.

Sundowner/Airport Manager Update - Monthly Board Report

Mr. Shadd presented Sundowner Aviation's monthly report, see attached to minutes. Fuel sales have gone up in December.

Mr. Shadd reported that Mr. Rooney talked to the insurance adjuster regarding the static aircraft. They are trying to sell it. They will owe the county for the ramp fee.

Mr. Szabrak reported that Eastland-Fairfield Career Center might be interested in the aircraft. They also will be calling to visit our airport for a tour. They are interested in a hangar for their general aviation technology program.

Mr. McNeer recommended that the hangar not be rented for no costs.

Mr. Shadd reported that there is a student from the Graham School located in Columbus is coming down and working with us in the maintenance hangar three (3) days a week. This is part of a program that they have and he is interested in working on aircrafts.

Mr. Kochis presented the Engineer's report, see attached to minutes.

FY2018 ODOT Aviation grant

The lighting project will restart in the spring. We will have a punch list before closing out the project.

<u>FY2018 FAA grant application - Construct Taxiway Delta</u> Mr. Kochis reported that he emailed the FAA a few weeks ago relating to the government shutdown.

<u>FY2019 ODOT Aviation grant -Rehabilitate Terminal Apron</u> Mr. Kochis reported that construction will start after the Airport's Anniversary Celebration, May 18, 2019.

b. Runway Protection Zone (RPZ) Tree Trimming

Nothing new to report.

c. Tax Assessments

Mr. Kochis reported that the Board of Education of the Lancaster City Schools made an appeal to the Fairfield County Board of Revision related to the new values of the Airport for parcel# 014-08005-00, #013-00678-00, and #013-08200-00.

d. Wildlife Control

Mr. Kochis asked the Board to review the estimate for the grass fescue from West Fairfield, Inc. This is the 4 acres that we have woods on. The next step is to plant fescue grass that keeps animals away. No action is needed tonight. He asked that the Board review the estimate. The work includes hydro-mulch. On the east end of the RPZ, there are 3 spot repairs, grading and filling. They will fill them in and grade them off. They will take the hump out, and seed all the grass. He is also waiting on additional estimates from other contractors. There will be about 32 acres of grass to mow.

Mr. Kochis stated that the Board still needs to work with HAS for the additional mowing.

e. Storm Water System Rehab

2. Community Relations - Michael Kaper & Rick Szabrak

Mr. Kaper reported that the Lancaster Eagle Gazette wrote an article on the Airport's economic impact, courtesy of Rick Szabrak.

He also reported that he had a few customer feedback emails. One was relating to flying at night and the other was related to model airplanes. Also, there was an email related to any openings for security.

Mr. Shadd reported that they have no positions available currently.

3. Facilities and Grounds - Michael Kaper & Bill Fagan

Mr. Kochis recommended that Mr. Kaper & Mr. Fagan be included in the HAS mowing discussion.

Airport Property/Old Med Flight House

Mr. Kochis reported that the Old Med Flight property needs winterized.

Mr. Brock stated he would submit a proposal to the Board next month relating to renting the property.

4. FBO Liaison - Pat Ferguson

Mr. Ferguson reported that Mr. Rooney got an estimate of \$1,300 for the fence repair. He told Mr. Rooney to proceed. The front door in the terminal was fixed. The back door now needs fixed.

Mr. Feguson reported that Russ Everson with HAS was using the snow thrower and ran into 2 garden hoses at the Gorsuch Aviation hangar. He thinks they have been replaced or repaired.

Mr. Kochis asked Sundowner Aviation to check in with Gorsuch Aviation.

Mr. Kochis asked Mr. Shadd if there were any plans to update the kitchen area. If that is being considered, he recommends that the carpet in the terminal be replaced.

Dr. Burns asked that Sundowner Aviation coordinate any terminal renovations or updates with Mr. Kaper and Mr. Fagan.

Mr. Ferguson reported that a trap was installed in the kitchen cabinet. The flexible lines were grounded in furnace room. It totaled around \$128.

Mr. Ferguson reported that the ramp coming out the alley near the R hangars to the taxiway is narrow. It is dangerous when snow is plowed. There is nowhere to put the snow. He suggested that area be filled in and paved.

5. Finance - Glenn Burns

Financial Reports

The Board reviewed the financial reports.

Ms. Knisley reported that the surplus for 2018 was \$25,000. The accumulated carryover was \$325,000.

Mr. Kochis recommended that the Board identify a priority list of capital projects to present to the Board of Commissioners.

6. Security - Jon Kochis & Bill McNeer

Mr. McNeer reported that Barefoot bandit is out of prison now. He's concerned with copycats. The best security is provided by the Airport Management, HAS & Tenants.

7. Tenant Relations - Glenn Burns & Bill Fagan

a. Rent Status Spreadsheet

The Board reviewed the spreadsheet.

Mr. Shadd reported that there is a new tenant in January and there will be at least one new tenant in February.

b. <u>Eastland-Fairfield Career Center Aviation Technology Program</u>
Mr. McNeer reported that a reduced rate on a hangar can be discussed.

Mr. Szabrak reported that now they are in the discussion stages. They are meeting here at 12:30 on Thursday if anyone would like to attend. Most of the curriculum will be done on campus but they would like to partner with the airport. There are 5 classes that they will be offering relating to aviation. Aviation, pilot training, aviation management, air traffic control, and Ground maintenance. There are no high school programs like this in central Ohio. They are capping it at 20 students. The goal is for students that aren't ready for college could consider jobs at the Columbus Airport and TSA. There are all kinds of different directions this program could go.

Dr. Burns stated this would be great to publicly announce the program at our anniversary celebration.

Mr. Szabrak reported that HAS could use the students as interns to work around the airport.

Mr. Fagan asked Mr. Shadd how many flight instructors are located at the airport.

Mr. Shadd reported that there are around 6 flight instructors at our airport.

Mr. Szabrak reported that if this program takes off, it could also lead to flight instruction.
