Regular Meeting to order

Mr. Glenn Burns called the Regular Meeting to order at 5:00 p.m. with the Pledge of Allegiance. The meeting was held with the following Board Members present: Bill McNeer, Scott Richardson, Glenn Burns, Jon Kochis and Bill Fagan. Also present were Emylee Gussler, Al Moyer, and Don Kuhn. Board members absent: Rick Szabrak and Michael Kaper.

Opportunity for the Public to Address the Board

No public comments.

Approval of the Minutes for the February 14, 2022 Meeting

On motion of Bill McNeer and second of Bill Fagan, the Fairfield County Airport Authority Board voted to approve the minutes from the February 14, 2022, meeting.

Historical Aircraft Squadron (HAS) update

<u>Fixed Base Operator (FBO)/Airport Management update with Sundowner Aviation – Monthly Board Report</u>

a. Monthly Report

Don Kuhn provided fuel report to board for review. Mr. Kuhn reported that low lead (LL) fuel cots has gone up \$1.01/gal.

Mr. Kuhn asked what could be done regarding the aircraft remaining in P20.

Jon Kochis stated that it must be posted on the hangar, a notice of eviction for 5 days – and then the board can proceed with the eviction process. The bailiff of the court will come to assist with the removal of the property from the hangar and the airport will store the property. The aircraft would then be tied down on the runway to secure and avoid the craft being a projectile. The airport board is not assuming liability for any damage to the property. Following this the tenant has an amount of time, set by the courts to retrieve

the property. If the tenant does not claim the property, then the property would be disposed of, perhaps by auction.

Mr. Kuhn provided copies of claims from R3 and R5 hangars for damage. Mr. Kochis stated that he would take the copies to Assistant Prosecutor Josh Horacek for review, however more information regarding the claims is necessary. Mr. Kuhn reported that something smoldering in R4 threw paint dust throughout 3 hangars and caused damage/cleaning to 3 hangars. Board inquired as to why they were not notified, and Mr. Kuhn said he was not aware that the board did not know. The incident occurred in January. Mr. Kuhn will speak with Pat Rooney for more information.

Scott Richardson asked Don Kuhn what LL fuel is right now. Mr. Kuhn reported that LL fuel cots has gone up \$1.01/gal.

Standing Committee Updates:

Airport Improvement - Jon Kochis

a. Engineer's Summary Report – Crawford Murphy Tilly, Inc. (CMT) CMT Absent.

Jon Kochis reported finalizing the close out for taxiway delta. MP is at FAA for approval & Layout plan. Taxiway Bravo drainage project going for bid Friday. Bids will be due April 5th. SRE building construction to begin Wednesday by Eversole. Will be freeing up 2 hangars for lease.

Mr. Kochis reported that the board will need to circle back to writing the new lease, adding in the cancellation of the lease if the tenant doesn't pay within 2 months. Language regarding this addition is on-hand from the prosecutor's office. Mr. Kochis suggested a bigger discussion regarding the new lease agreement verbiage. Mr. Kochis suggested a workgroup for the new lease and considering new rates. Mr. Kochis will continue the discussion on the lease agreements at another time.

Mr. Kochis updated regarding the Ohio 22 state grant – Phase 1 - lots of trees are gone with approximately 5 more to remove.

Mr. Kochis reported that Phase 2 is underway and there is a need to reach agreement with 3 landowners regarding the removal of the trees on their properties. Mr. Cooper has been contacted. Mr. Schafer (sp) landowner passed away in January and Michael Kaper is in contact with the family. Mr. Paulus is interested in trimming, which is not ideal. Mr. Kochis reported that a trim of the trees would buy about 5 years.

Mr. Kochis reported that for the MP – Commissioners are interested in building more hangars, potentially hangars C & M. Mr. Kochis mentioned that in a community hangar, discussion would need to happen regarding how priority would be decided for use.

Glenn Burns inquired with Don Kuhn if there is ever request for use of a large hangar for a jet. Mr. Kuhn stated that there have been requests, though not many.

Mr. Kochis reported on the ACIP – there is a new column labeled "infrastructure". Due to the infrastructure bill, funds have been awarded and the board has been asked to earmark projects by the FAA.

Mr. Kochis reported that next on the plan is a study regarding the water drainage, followed by the north taxiway apron design and environmental study and local paving in 2023, as well as applying for western approach obstruction removal and T Hangar taxiway design. Going into 2024, taxiway design, T hangar and a new entrance drive.

Mr. Kochis reported that fence along the road from the entrance to the plane will be replaced by the water department with 6 ft fence as the existing 4ft fence needs to be removed for the laying of new water pipe. Mr. Kochis stated that the board may want to discuss if they want to continue the 6ft fence around HAS.

b. Storm Water System Rehab/Culvert Repair

Mr. Kochis presented the invoice from Kull Excavating for materials only, is included in the bill list, reflected in the amount, for payment so that the project can begin.

Community Relations - Michael Kaper & Rick Szabrak

No report – Rick Szabrak & Michael Kaper absent.

Facilities and Grounds - Michael Kaper & Bill Fagan

Bill Fagan reported on the R1 water leak – 2 quotes received.

Mr. Kochis received a quote from River Valley Restorations was to get on roof and pull and repair screws and grommets, but additional work would be at additional cost. The estimate is general. The cause of the leak is still unknown.

Mr. Fagan stated that the quote he received from Mr. Sharpe was to replace the screws and grommets, but an estimate for the rest would come after getting on the roof. Mr. Fagan reported that Mr. Sharpe did not get on the roof to provide the estimate.

Mr. Kochis supposed that the leak may have been from an ice jam, which upon melting pooled and leaked into the unit.

Bill McNeer suggested that someone get on the roof or utilize a drone to view the damage and provide an estimate.

Mr. Kochis suggested using Mr. Sharpe to complete repairs up to the \$750. Anything additional would require a new quote. No motion needed – under \$1000.00

• 3383 Old Columbus - Gas & Electric Bills & Renewal of Lease

Jon Kochis reported there is no renewal of lease on the calendar for the house on premises. NE Ohio Gas increased the rates, resulting in an increase of utility cost, no increase in the water invoices. Mr. Kochis reported that Setterlin has access for storage as well. Mr. Kochis suggests extending the lease to February of 2023 and not charging them any of the extra cost over the existing bills. Lease states by EAA request, the lease is renewed. Mr. Kochis to take it to the Commissioners for completion.
