Special Meeting to discuss the Strategic Planning for the Master Plan

Dr. Burns called the special meeting to order at 5:03 p.m. The meeting was held with the following Board Members present: Glenn Burns, Jon Kochis, Rick Szabrak, Scott Richardson, Bill McNeer, Bill Fagan, and Michael Kaper. Also present were Staci Knisley, Patrick Rooney, and, Haylee Koester, Nick Brown (via telephone), and Al Moyer.

Mr. Kochis reported that there has been a survey related to the Airport created by Crawford Murphy Tilly (CMT). Ms. Knisley emailed it to all tenants that have registered their email address. The survey is open until June 30th.

Mr. Kochis sent the survey to Kirkbride. Mr. Szabrak will send it to Performance and Outerbelt Brewery. These are businesses that are near the Airport. There are a few other surrounding businesses they will send the survey to.

Mr. Kochis reported that Ms. Knisley submitted the fuel sales data from 2013 and forward to CMT. She also sent the Aircraft Based Registry list of aircrafts to CMT.

Ms. Koester with CMT reported that Airport management submitted their data that CMT requested.

Mr. Kochis reported that he and CMT consultants had a site visit. They went through most of the facilities here at the Airport. They viewed inside and outside of the facilities.

Ms. Koester reported that they got a lot of information from the site visit.

Mr. Brown with CMT stated they got a good start on the data.

Ms. Koester reported that the site visit will help with the inventory part of the master plan. For the forecast portion, the Airport Management data will help us with the number of operations. They will compare those numbers to the social economic data that they have pulled.

Mr. Brown reported that they are still in the data gathering and building data phase. They received good information at the site visit and data from Airport management. They are working on the estimate of operations that they have today, the past, and the number of operations for the next 10 years. They are using the Traffic Flow Management System Counts (TMFSC) that is maintained by the FAA. It does only capture a portion of operations of local airports. They are building the data. Once they have all the data, that will allow us to compare it to other data points lie, how population is tracked over the last 10 years and migration patterns. That will allow us to find the growth of the Airport in the next 10 years. They are on track to have some preliminary numbers at July's board meeting.

Mr. Kochis asked where we are falling in the schedule for proposals and project ideas.

Mr, Brown stated that it should fall in the original timeline of August. They will probably come up with some general schemes to see what is next. The board members will participate in the process and come up with priorities.

Mr. Kochis stated that then it puts us to September for the public input for the projects selected. Then the finalizing should be around November or December.

Mr. Brown stated that they intend on getting recommendations by then.

Dr. Burns stated that the Board is in Recess at 5:17 p.m.

Regular Meeting to order

Dr. Burns called the Regular Meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. with the Pledge of Allegiance. The meeting was held with the following Board Members present: Glenn Burns, Michael Kaper, Jon Kochis, Scott Richardson, Bill McNeer, Bill Fagan, and Rick Szabrak. Also present were Staci Knisley, Patrick Rooney, Al Moyer, and Kip Kelsey.

On motion of Jon Kochis and second of Bill McNeer, the Fairfield County Airport Authority Board voted to approve the minutes from the May 10, 2021 meeting.

Historical Aircraft Squadron (HAS) update

a. Weed Control Proposal

Mr. Kelsey reported that in 2020 HAS sprayed the weeds for weed control. HAS also put the first application on in 2021. There have been no past fees submitted from HAS. HAS now has a proposal to do the weed application for \$2,500. They have a 30-gallon tank for the application. They go through about 15 tanks per application. It takes about an hour for one tank. If you add up

all the time it is about 36-man hours for the application. It is about \$70 an hour per person. Their proposal is being bid as a project. They wear hazmat suits, and the weather is extremely hot, and it is a miserable job. The \$2,500 does not cover materials.

Mr. Moyer reported that they purchase the herbicide materials from Tractor Supply.

Mr. Kochis asked HAS to purchase the material and include it in their proposal.

Mr. Kochis reported that he was involved with the Hunters Run Conservancy District's project on the Rockmill Dam and its costs were about \$2,600. This is a good price comparison.

Mr. Kochis added that Soil & Water does a separate part of the weed spraying at the Airport. The areas that they spray involve the water areas. They are the only ones licensed to do the application. It's about \$1,800 annually. We also have the weed control agreement with Doug Majors.

Mr. Kelsey reported that they start out with Round-Up and then use another over the counter product that kills the crab grass and all the weeds. They still have some areas they need to clean up after the first application. The \$2,500 includes the spring applications only. The fall application if needed would be a separate proposal.

Approval for HAS to finish the Spring weed control applications for \$2,500 plus material costs with a not to exceed of \$300.

On motion of Jon Kochis and second of Michael Kaper, the Fairfield County Airport Authority Board voted to approve HAS to finish the Spring weed control applications for \$2,500 plus material costs with a not to exceed of \$300.

Voting aye thereon: Kochis, Kaper, Burns, Fagan, Richardson, Szabrak, and McNeer Motion passed.

b. HAS update

Mr. Moyer reported that Steve Slater donated some grass seed. They will spread it around the bare spots at the Airport. The zero-turn mower needs to be repaired. The rear wheel came off without the nuts. The nuts are still on the plate.

Mr. Kochis reported that he will bring a trailer over tomorrow to tow it to Ag Pro.

Mr. Moyer requested Ag Pro to place the rear new tires also.

- Mr. Kochis stated that if there is a need for new tires, get that replaced also.
- Mr. Moyer reported that he will get an estimate from Ag Pro before authorizing the repair.

Approval of not to exceed \$2,000 for the repairs to the zero-turn mower with Ag-Pro

On motion of Jon Kochis and second of Michael Kaper, the Fairfield County Airport Authority Board voted to of not to exceed \$2,000 for the repairs to the zero-turn mower with Ag-Pro.

Voting aye thereon: Kochis, Kaper, Burns, Fagan, Richardson, Szabrak, and McNeer Motion passed.

Sundowner Aviation/Airport Manager Update - Monthly Board Report

a. Update

Mr. Rooney reported that the fuel truck is here. They are still waiting on the filter to be replaced.

Mr. Rooney reported that he had a request for an additional porta john near the F&G hangar rows. The estimated costs would be about an additional \$100 per month.

Ms. Knisley will increase the purchase order to Porta Kleen to reflect 2 Porta Johns's at the Airport.

b. Monthly Report

Mr. Rooney presented the Airport Management Monthly Report. (See attached to minutes)

c. Business View Magazine

Mr. Rooney asked the Board to review the information.

d. Hangar Waiting List discussion

Mr. McNeer asked if the Board wanted to pursue charging a deposit to be on the waiting list.

Mr. Kochis stated that the Board has lots of things to consider before charging a deposit for the waiting list. A policy change might be needed, and we will need to work out the logistics first.

Mr. Rooney stated that Airport Management would keep a list of who made the deposits.

Dr. Burns stated that having a deposit would alleviate those on the waiting list who do not have an aircraft.

Mr. Szabrak recommended that the list be kept digitally and annually or semi-annually the list be reviewed and refunded if not still interested.

Ms. Knisley recommended that the policy be approved and posted on our webpage. She also recommended that she create an object code within the Airport Operations fund specifically for the hangar waiting list.

Mr. Kochis will work on a policy and form with the help of Mr. Szabrak and Ms. Knisley.

Standing Committee Updates:

Airport Improvement - Jon Kochis

a. Engineer's Summary Report - Crawford Murphy Tilly, Inc. (CMT)

Mr. Kochis reviewed the CMT report. (See attached to minutes)

Mr. Kochis reported that the Snow Removal Equipment (SRE) building project is now joined with Fairfield County SWAT. CMT will be retained for the SWAT portion. We hope to go out to bid in July. The construction process for these type of buildings goes quick.

b. South Access Road/Culvert Repair - Roese Bros. Paving update

Mr. Kochis reported that the project start date has been delayed but will be completed in 2021.

c. Storm Water System Rehab

Mr. Kochis reported that he has been working with Soil & Water. He recommends that that the Airport Board to propose to the Board of Commissioners the capital improvement project to create a parallel 8-inch drainage tile to the pipelines that will collect water from the wet area all the way to the creek. It will connect any of the existing lines and will run it into the creek. The pipeline is decommissioning one of the pipelines. They will allow us to dig in that area. We will bring on an engineering firm to design it. We can request up to \$50,000 with the Board of Commissioners. He will have an estimate hopefully by the July meeting.

PROPOSAL FOR AIRPORT WEED CONTOL/SPRAYING

This proposal is for H.A.S. to do the spraying for weed control at Fairfield County Airport. This will include the spraying of runway, taxiways, hanger alleys, ramp areas and parking lot. Follow up application will be included within several weeks of initial application as needed.

Weed spraying consists of the following:

- We will use a 30 gal. tank pulled behind our Gator.
- Application time per tank is about 1 hour. Addition 30 minutes required to mix chemicals and clean and neutralize residue in tank when finished for day.
- Both last year and this year we use 15 tanks of fluid. An additional 1 to 2 tanks are needed for follow up treatment.
- Application is weather dependent.
- The weed herbicide is obtained at Tractor Supply using our discount.
 That cost will be covered by the Airport.
- Our fee for airport weed spraying and control is \$2500.
- Weed spraying will be done in the Spring. If the Airport wants to have an addition spraying in the Fall, an additional \$2500 fee will apply.
