Master Plan – Nearing completion. Forecasts approved. Facility requirements comments addressed – FAA review underway. Alternatives prepared, Submitted to FAA for review. ALP drafting underway – target in early December.

Rehab Taxiway B -

Due to delays in grant funding and contract execution, Shelly Co has requested a price increase due to material cost escalation. After discussions with FAA and Shelly, project will be rebid in Feb/March 2022. Construction anticipated for early 2023 if possible.

Improve Airfield Drainage – Design. Project bid. Successful bidder - Rock River Construction at \$1,090,820. Grant awarded and signed on Aug 10. ODOT matching grant resolution needed for FY22 construction grant. Note request of additional work request by CMT for additional design, stormwater analysis regarding drainage required. Eligible for grant participation – note that this will create savings during proposed Stormwater master plan work.
