### Meeting to order

Glen Burns called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. with the Pledge of Allegiance. Board Members present at the meeting were Glenn Burns, Bill McNeer, Pat Ferguson, Jon Kochis, Bill Fagan, Rick Szabrak, and Michael Kaper. Also present were Staci Knisley, Al Moyer, Jimmy Shadd, Greg Heaton, Eric Meister, and Kip Kelsey.

### Opportunity for the Public to Address the Board

No members of the public addressed the Board.

### Approval of Minutes for the November 11, 2019 meeting

On motion of Bill McNeer and second of Jon Kochis, the Fairfield County Airport Authority Board voted to approve the minutes from the November 11, 2019 meeting.

Voting aye thereon: McNeer, Kochis, Ferguson, Burns, Szabrak, Fagan, and Kaper Motion passed.

### Historical Aircraft Squadron (HAS) update

Mr. Moyer reported that the truck donated by the Engineer's office is ready to be picked up and will need to be transferred for county inventory.

Ms. Knisley will contact the Engineer's Office and process the transfer of the asset,

Mr. Moyer also reported that the John Deere tractor has an anti-freeze leak. It is out for repair.

Mr. Kelsey thanked Jon Kochis for putting together the new lease for HAS with the Board of Commissioners that will be effective January 1, 2020 once completed and approved.

Mr. Kelsey reported that there was another discussion regarding the snow removal and mowing contract between HAS and the Airport Authority Board. HAS was under the impression that when the new snow removal and mowing contract was approved that the monthly rent of \$600 to the Commissioners would be terminated. HAS requests three (3) months or \$1,800 reimbursement from the Airport Authority Board.

Mr. Kochis reported that the Airport Authority Board has no authority to terminate the Commissioners agreement with HAS. The agreement was tied into the debt service which ends at the end of 2019. He apologized if he misled HAS in prior discussions.

Ms. Knisley stated that the lease with the Board of Commissioners is separate from the Snow Removal and Mowing Contract with HAS.

Mr. McNeer recommends the Board revisit the request in January after the lease expires at the end of 2019.

Mr. Kelsey stated that he appreciates the Board's consideration.

### Sundowner Aviation/Airport Manager Update - Monthly Board Report

### a. Monthly Report

Mr. Shadd reviewed the monthly report, see attached to minutes. The hangars are full. We have 10 people on the waiting list. There are 8 on the T-hangar list and 2 on the R hangar list. Fuel Sales are up compared to prior year November sales. He is actively working on fixed assets inventory that is due to the County Auditor on January 3<sup>rd</sup>.

Ms. Knisley asked that on December 31<sup>st</sup> a representative be available to meet with the County Auditor and State Auditor to review the fuel count. The State Auditor selects a few departments each year to visit and monitor the end of year process.

Mr. Shadd will be available that day.

### **Standing Committee Updates**

### Airport Improvement - Jon Kochis

### a. Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) teleconference

Mr. Kochis reported that the FAA teleconference with FAA representative, Katie Delaney was held today. Mr. Kochis, Mr. McNeer, and Mr. Szabrak all were on the call. We submitted our Airport Improvement Plan (AIP) for the next 10 years. We have an aggressive schedule and good support from the Board of Commissioners. We are asking for our entitlement and additional monies.

Mr. Kochis reported that Ms. Delaney recommended requesting additional monies 2 years ahead of time.

Mr. Kochis stated that it is important that our Master Plan is ready to go when asking for additional monies. At the moment, we are tabling the Master Plan in the spring unless the FAA approves the additional monies.

Mr. Heaton reported that it was a very positive phone call. The FAA 5010 form claims that there are still shrubs on the east end of the approach. Mr. Kochis asked the ODOT representative to contact the Airport when visiting the airport.

### b. Engineer's Summary Report - Greg Heaton with Crawford Murphy Tilly, Inc. (CMT)

Mr. Heaton reviewed the summary report, see attached to minutes.

Mr. Kochis reported that CMT has an agreement for the construction phase for the ODOT project. The agreement will have to be reviewed and approved by the Prosecutor before presenting to the Board.

Mr. Kochis recommended that the scope of work for the Master Plan be sent to the FAA. It is about 95% completed. Mr. Szabrak will add the remaining 5% relating to the feasibility study. We are financially good to pay for the plan locally but would like to send it to the FAA to let them know we are serious. If the FAA finds additional monies, they could plan.

Mr. Szabrak reported that the plan is not just about economic development opportunities. I will include a vision plan of where the Board wants to be as a long-term goal. The goal could be keeping the Airport self-staining or seeing what other airports focus on. HAS located here is a unique attraction compared to other airports in central Ohio. We will look at our potential for the next 20 years. The plan will help us guide what we wanted to do with the land here.

Mr. Kochis stated that Mr. Szabrak has about a year to develop the rest of the plan unless the FAA decides there are grant dollars available.

Mr. Kochis will send the draft scope of work to the FAA this week.

## Approval to proceed with the application for the FY2020 Airport Matching grant program from the Office of Aviation/Ohio Department of Transportation

On motion of Bill McNeer and second of Michael Kaper, the Airport Authority Board voted to proceed with the application for the FY2020 Airport Matching grant program from the Office of Aviation/Ohio Department of Transportation. (See Resolution and other documents attached to minutes)

Voting aye thereon: McNeer, Kaper, Burns, Ferguson, Szabrak, Fagan, and Kochis Motion passed.

### c. Storm Water System Rehab

### 4<sup>th</sup> Quarter Storm Water Inspection Report

Mr. Kochis reviewed the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter storm water inspection report completed by Jonathan Ferbrache with Fairfield County Soil & Water. (See email notes and report attached to minutes.)

Mr. Kochis reported that there is a copy in the binder here at the terminal. He encouraged that oil containers are labeled, and lids replaced according to the recommendations by Mr. Ferbrache. The yellow can at the Fuel Farm needs checked out. In the future, we also need to consider replacing our main culvert after the runway is repaved in 12-15 years. It will be expensive to replace. After Taxiway B is completed, that culvert will also need replaced. The goal is to show our drainage is good and eliminate FEMA's floodplain thoughts on the north side.

Mr. Heaton recommended that the culvert could be lined. He will follow-up with a recommendation.

### Tile Repair – Kull Excavating

Mr. Kochis reported that the work has not started yet. He will report status again next month.

### Strategic Planning Committee - Bill McNeer, Jon Kochis, Rick Szabrak

Mr. Kochis reported that the committee will meet after the master plan is developed.

### Community Relations - Michael Kaper & Rick Szabrak

Mr. Kaper reported that he received an email request regarding parachuting.

### FBO Liaison - Pat Ferguson

### Hangar J Awnings

Mr. Shadd reported that Todd Whiley with Restofab is working on the awnings. Sundowner Aviation will pay him directly and seek reimbursement from the Airport Authority Board. It will cost approximately \$900.

- Mr. Ferguson recommended that the driveway to the hangars needs to be repaired.
- Mr. Kochis reported that this will have to be budgeted with local dollars.
- Mr. Ferguson requested that Precision Overhead Door look at the HAS clam shell door.
- Mr. Kelsey reported that the door has 6-8-inch gap when the door is fully closed.

### Approval to proceed with the repair of HAS clam shell door with a not to exceed of \$1,000

On motion of Pat Ferguson and second of Bill McNeer, the Fairfield County Airport Authority Board voted to approve to proceed with the repair of HAS clam shell door with a not to exceed of \$1,000.

Voting aye thereon: McNeer, Burns, Fagan, Szabrak, Kochis, and Kaper

Abstaining was: Ferguson

Motion passed.

### Facilities and Grounds - Michael Kaper & Bill Fagan

### a. Hangar J

Mr. Kochis reported that there is a leak in restroom during rain. Walsh Construction was the contractor for the terminal renovations. They contacted the roofing contractor, CCS Roofing who installed our roof. They provide a 2-year work warranty, but the roofing material has a 20-year warranty. The Company Firestone is being contacted for the material replacement. Mr. Kochis has copy of the warranty.

Mr. Kochis reported that in Hangar J, where the wall meets the roof, the corner trim has a gap in it and water comes in the sides of the building. We can either replace with 6-inch corner or sealing the gap somehow. He recommends to seal where the corner meets the ceiling.

Mr. Shadd reported that the same corner, the northeast corner of the hangar has rodent damage.

Mr. Kochis has been working with an Engineer but needs to follow-up with Engineer for the scope of work. He has nothing completed to date.

Mr. Heaton recommended that they have a structural Engineer in his office review and make a recommendation and design for Hangar J's repair.

## Approval to proceed with an engineering design from Crawford Murphy Tilly, Inc. (CMT) suitable for bidding for the repair to Hangar J

On motion of Jon Kochis and second of Bill Fagan, the Fairfield County Airport Authority Board voted to proceed with engineering design from Crawford Murphy Tilly, Inc. (CMT) suitable for bidding for the repair to Hangar J.

Discussion: Mr. Kochis reported that the engineer he previously worked with has not submitted an invoice and no agreement was signed.

Voting aye thereon: Kochis, Fagan, Burns, Ferguson, Szabrak, Kaper and McNeer Motion passed.

On motion of Jon Kochis and second of Pat Ferguson, the Fairfield County Airport Authority Board motioned to approve retroactively November payments totaling \$45,270.26. (See attached to minutes)

Voting aye thereon: Kochis, Ferguson, Burns, Fagan, McNeer, Szabrak, and Kaper. Motion passed.

### Security & Safety - Jon Kochis & Bill McNeer

Mr. Shadd reported that Claypool Electric came out to repair the magnetic piece of the gate. It is still not working correctly. They diagnosed that it was a bad sensor. They ordered a sensor. For now, we will manually open and close the gate.

### Tenant Relations - Glenn Burns & Bill Fagan

a. Rent Status Spreadsheet

The Board reviewed the rent status spreadsheet.

### b. Hangar Rental fees for 2020

Ms. Knisley reported that she only had one negative comment regarding the increase in rent. There are some rent amounts for December and January that will need to be reconciled. Some tenants have paid their increase too soon. She anticipates some tenants will send the old amount in January.

Ms. Knisley asked the Board if there is still a discount for tenants that sign a one year lease.

The Board will not offer a discount for 2020.

### Sundowner Aviation Lease for Hangar J

Mr. Kochis reviewed the draft lease agreement with the Board. He asked the Board to negotiate the length of the new lease and the amount per square foot with Sundowner Aviation rather than Mr. Kochis on his own.

Mr. Kochis highlighted some changes and suggestions:

- The lessee (Sundowner Aviation) will be responsible for the electricity bills and the lessor (FCAA Board) will provide water and sewer at no charge. Water and Sewer are for to be used for general use and will not conflict with the Environmental section # 6 and not to conflict with the stormwater plan.
- The Repair and Maintenance section changes suggested by Sundowner Aviation are for any repairs over \$150, they request that the costs be taken care of by the lessor.
- Another change suggested by Mr. McNeer, is that the loft is above the office above cannot be used as storage.

Mr. Kochis reviewed the current lease agreement square footage. The current lease agreement has a monthly rent of \$775 per month. The Hangar is estimated at 5,800 square feet (74 x 80 feet) For comparable information, Hangars in row R are \$.17 (17 cents) per square foot. The T-hangars are not comparable. Hangars in Row R are better insulated. The office space in Hangar J is approximately 700 square feet plus restrooms. They are burning oil for their HVAC. The lessee is currently responsible for maintenance.

Mr. Shadd stated that Hangar J is one of the oldest buildings on the grounds.

Mr. Kochis reported that Pat Rooney originally proposed \$.15 (15 cents) per square foot.

Mr. Kochis recommends that \$.17 (17 cents) per square foot be the Board's approach. The lessee will no longer be responsible for repairs over \$150. Until the new lease is signed, the lessee will still be responsible for all repairs.

Mr. Shadd would like to proceed with the new lease agreement but cannot authorize any more than \$.13 (13 cents) per square foot without his partners Darrell Loos and Pat Rooney.

Mr. McNeer stated that \$.15 (15 cents) seems reasonable.

Dr. Burns agreed. He recommends that the lease agreement be tabled for January.

### d. Monthly Hangar Lease

Mr. Kochis reported that he will follow up with the Prosecutor on updated language section relating to termination of the agreement.

Mr. McNeer asked that the lease and/or minimum standards be reviewed regarding painting.

HAS cannot charge for events but can negotiate charges for set-up, security or other services. The Board of Commissioners as the lessor has rights with 30-day notice to use the facility as a public space.

## TABLED - Approval to accept the HAS lease agreement with the Fairfield County Board of Commissioners

On motion of Jon Kochis and second of Rick Szabrak, the Fairfield County Airport Authority Board voted to accept the HAS lease agreement with the Fairfield County Board of Commissioners.

Discussion: Mr. Heaton wants to confirm that HAS is still classified as a museum. We want to make sure that we are not violating FAA regulations. The building still needs to remain a museum.

Mr. Ferguson stated that HAS cannot sublease to any for profit organizations.

Mr. Kelsey stated that there is verbiage in the agreement that could cover the terminating the lease agreement for proper conduct.

Mr. Heaton recommends that the HAS tax status be reviewed and researched by the County Prosecutor.

Mr. Szabrak stated that it could be realistic that HAS could not operate any longer and they could keep their equipment in there until the lease is up. That could happen realistically.

Mr. Kochis will consult with the County Prosecutor on the termination and HAS status.

On motion of Bill McNeer and second Michael Kaper, the Fairfield County Airport Authority Board voted to table the HAS lease agreement with the Fairfield County Board of Commissioners.

Upon execution of the Grant Contract, these Standard Assurances are incorporated into and become part of the Grant Contract. Pursuant to the Ohio Airport Grant Program Standard Procedure, the Applicant/Sponsor: The Fairfield County Airport Authority hereby assures the Ohio Department of Transportation that:

- 1. The Airport for which Grant Funds are requested is not eligible to receive FAA Air Carrier Enplanement Funds or FAA Cargo Funds.
- 2. The Applicant has received a Grant Offer from FAA for the eligible project and provided a copy of that Grant Offer to ODOT.
- 3. The Applicant will inform ODOT if any grants from non-ODOT sources (other than the Applicant and FAA) will be used to pay for any part of the project.
- 4. The Grant Funds will be used to provide 5% of the non-federal portion of the eligible funding for the project.
- 5. There will be no increase in the amount of this ODOT Matching Grant subsequent to execution of the grant agreement (i.e., there will be no "change orders").
- 6. The Applicant's Governing Body has passed a resolution authorizing this Application.
- 7. The Applicant has sufficient funds available for that portion of the project costs which will not be paid by ODOT, and the required local funding for the project as described in the application has been appropriated.
- 8. The Applicant has sufficient funds available to ensure operation and maintenance of all items funded under this grant agreement which it will own or control.
- Any equipment purchased with ODOT grant funds will be expected to be operated for at least 20 years from the date of the Grant Contract unless the Applicant receives written permission from the Director of Transportation to discontinue operating the equipment. Such written permission shall include instructions on how to dispose of the equipment and what to do with the proceeds of any sale of the equipment.
- 10. In the case of real property acquired with funds from this grant, if the facilities cease to be an airport at any time, the Applicant agrees to return to the State a percentage of the appraised fair market value of the of the real property at the time the facility ceases to be an airport. The percentage shall be the same as the original State percentage of total project cost (i.e., 5%)
- 11. The public shall be afforded use of the Airport and of its facilities for aviation purposes as fully and equally as all other parties, in accordance with Ohio Revised Code 4561.11 and no sale, transfer, assignment, rental, lease or sublease shall be denied because of race, color, religion, sex, military status, ancestry, disability or national origin.

- 12. If the facilities cease to be an airport within 20 years from the date of the Grant Contract, the Applicant agrees to return the full amount of the Grant Funds to the state.
- 13. The terms, conditions and assurances of this grant agreement shall remain in full force and effect throughout the useful life of the facilities developed or equipment acquired for an airport development or rehabilitation project, but in any event not to exceed twenty (20) years from the date of acceptance of a grant offer of State funds for the project.
- 14. The Applicant will comply with all federal, state and local laws, rules and executive orders, as they apply to Airports and to the performance of the project.
- 15. The Applicant agrees to maintain all Airport owned or controlled Part 77 surfaces free of obstructions that can feasibly be removed or provide a formal airspace review of the obstruction completed by the FAA.
- 16. The Applicant certifies that it has implemented an effective airport pavement maintenance program and assures that it will use such program for the useful life of any pavement reconstructed, rehabilitated or repaired with ODOT funds.
- 17. During the performance of the project, the Applicant will comply with all applicable State and Federal Environmental requirements. Examples include the National Environmental Policy Act, the Clean Air Act, the Clean Water Act, the Endangered Species Act, among others.
- 18. Grantee agrees to comply with all applicable state and federal laws regarding drug-free workplace. Grantee shall make a good faith effort to ensure that all Grantee employees, while working on state property, will not purchase, transfer, use or possess illegal drugs or alcohol or abuse prescription drugs in any way

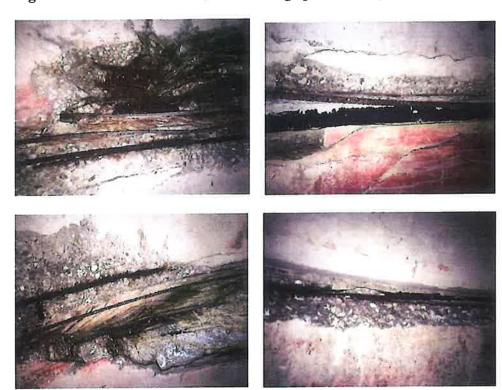

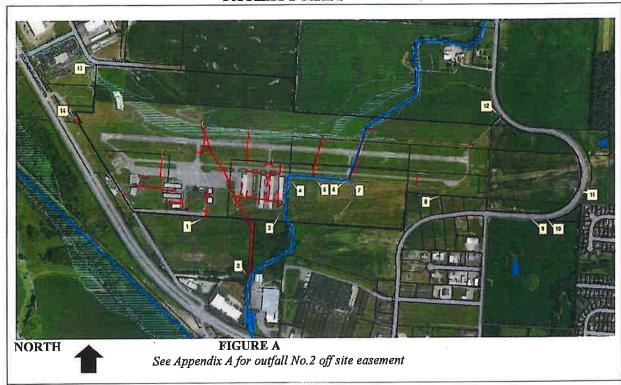

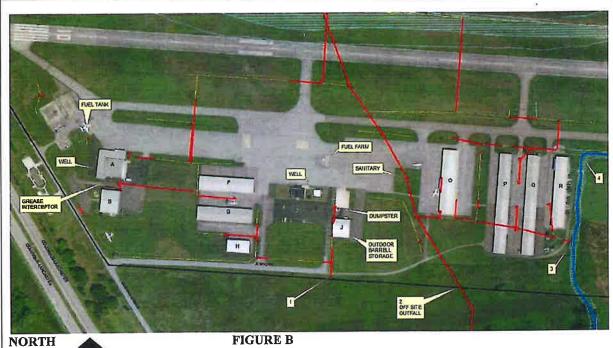
